

Popsicle Painting

1. Fill an ice tray with water and sprinkle in a little bit of Kool-Aid (several different flavors) into each cube.
2. Place a popsicle stick in each cube and freeze.
3. Remove when frozen and use to paint watercolors on white paper.

Bubble Prints

Materials:

Dish soap (Dawn works best), water, straws, food coloring, plastic glasses and light colored paper.

Description:

1. First fill 3 to 4 cups about 3/4 full with water.
2. Add dish soap (you will need quite a bit).
3. Add a few drops of food coloring to each cup.
4. Ask the children to take a straw and put it into the bubble solution. Instruct them to BLOW not suck or they'll get a yucky surprise in their mouth. You might practice blowing first. Ask them to blow until the bubbles are coming up over the top of the cup.
5. Ask them to lay their paper over the cup and the bubbles will pop leaving a beautiful design on the paper.
